Survey of Family Therapy Training and Employment in Europe – 2025, EFTA

Background to Survey

Survey Design: As part of the EFTA Training Standards Task Force, we sought information through a survey to capture family therapy training and service delivery practices in different countries. The information gathered was used to review and update EFTA training standards for family therapists in Europe. The questionnaire was divided into 11 short sections.

Data Collection: Through the NFTO chamber in EFTA and with the assistance of Task Force members, we asked one person per country, with experience of training and knowledge of family therapy service provision. to fill up this survey. A nominated person from the EFTA Task Force on Training Standards was allocated to link with each person and was available to help if needed.

The survey design took into account that there would be variations across countries. We asked the person filling in the survey to provide us with a general idea of the training of family therapists from their perspective. We appreciated that some elements of the questionnaire needed elaboration to more fully explain specifics in the individual context. We provided for a number of open sections for such commentary.

Presentation of Data: The data in this report provides a descriptive overview some aspects of family therapy training and service provision across 35 countries. It is intended to publish a more detailed analysis of family therapy training in Europe – using the data in this report.
