Vassilis has 27years of experience as an addiction –family therapist and 25years of experience as a group therapist . He studied counselling – psychotherapy and management of health organizations and completed his master’s degree in Counselling Psychology in England .

*In 2000 he founded together with two of his colleagues he founded the **Centre for Research of Human Behavior** , which is the first private sector organization in the field of addiction and prevention in Greece .*

Vassilis has been actively involved in actions regarding prevention, therapy and education of professionals in the health care sector both in Greece and Cyprus .

In 2008 he was honored and awarded for his outstanding contribution in the mental health field by the Minister of health in Cyprus . In 2015 the Centre for Research received an award of being amongst the 15 most influential organizations in Greece regarding their impact to communities (Social impact awards)

*In 2002 he began a 10-year training in Systemic approach at the **Athenian Institute of Anthropos**, specializing in family therapy, group therapy, and systemic practice . For the last 10years, he has a position as a clinical and training associate at the Athenian Institute of Anthropos . He’s actively involved in family, one to one and group therapy, supervision to health professionals and teaching in seminars for systemic leadership and organizational growth .*
